


MUNICIPALITY LIST



Local Lobbying Fact:

The reporting requirements set forth in Legislative Law Article 1-a apply to any municipality exceeding a population of over 50,000 persons. Thus, if a lobbyist incurs or receives in excess of \$5,000 annually in compensation and expenses for lobbying activities before such municipality, the lobbyist and the client of the lobbyist are required to file financial reports with JCOPE. JCOPE, in turn, makes these reports publicly available on its website.




Local Lobbying Fact:

As of April 1, 2002, registration and reporting are requirements for anyone engaged in lobbying before a qualifying municipality or subdivision in New York State.

Local Lobbying Fact:


Local lobbying is any attempt to influence:

1. any determination by a public official; or by a person or entity working in cooperation with a public official related to a governmental procurement;
2. the passage or defeat of any local law, ordinance, resolution, or regulation by any municipality or subdivision thereof;

Local Lobbying Fact:


Local lobbying is any attempt to influence:

3. the adoption, issuance, rescission, modification or terms of an executive order issued by the chief executive officer of a municipality;
4. the adoption or rejection of any rule, regulation, or resolution having the force and effect of a local law, ordinance, resolution, or regulation; or
5. the outcome of any rate making proceeding by any municipality or subdivision



The definition of a "Municipal Agency" also includes industrial development agencies in jurisdictional subdivisions with a population of more than 50,000; and public authorities, and public corporations, but shall not include school districts.

Lobbyist Requirements include:

- Biennial Statement of Registration
- \$200 Registration fee (\$100 prorated for the second year of a two year period.)
- All applicable bi-monthly reports.

Therefore, for each client, a lobbyist will check **only one applicable box**, .

All other forms, due dates, compensation, expenses etc. will remain unchanged.
