

**NOTICE OF REASONABLE CAUSE**

Pursuant to Executive Law §94(12)(a), the Commission on Public Integrity ("Commission") finds that there is reasonable cause to believe that Patricia Lynch Associates, Inc. knowingly and willfully violated Legislative Law §1-e(a)(4) by accepting a check dated January 25, 2006, number 10615, for lobbying services, prior to filing with this Commission, a formal agreement or summary of oral agreement authorizing them to lobby on behalf of Subcontractors Trade Association.

As required by law, a copy of this notice is retained by the Commission for public inspection. Please be advised, that pursuant to Legislative Law §1-o(b) a lobbyist, public corporation, or client who knowingly and willfully fails to file a statement or report within the time required for the filing of such report, shall be subject to a civil penalty for each violation in the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars. In addition, pursuant to Legislative Law §1-o(c), a lobbyist, public corporation, or client who knowingly and willfully files a false statement or report shall be subject to a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed the fifty thousand dollars, to be assessed by the Commission.
