
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**NOTICE OF REASONABLE CAUSE**

Pursuant to Executive Law §94(12)(b), the New York State Commission on Public Integrity ("Commission") has determined that there is reasonable cause to believe that you knowingly and intentionally violated Public Officers Law §73(8)(a)(i) when, within two years of leaving State service, you appeared and practiced and rendered services for compensation before the Westchester County Healthcare Corporation ("WCHC"), your former agency, in that as a Clinical Pharmacist of Cardinal Health, Inc. ("Cardinal"), commencing on or about June 5, 2007 until the present, you have been performing duties as a Cardinal employee at WCHC.

As required by law, a copy of this notice is retained by the Commission for public inspection and a copy is forwarded to WCHC, your former appointing authority. Please be advised that an individual who, following a hearing, is found to have knowingly and intentionally violated the provisions of Public Officers Law §73(8)(a)(i) shall be subject to a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars and the value of any gift, compensation or benefit received as a result of such violation.
