

**NOTICE OF REASONABLE CAUSE**

Pursuant to Executive Law §94(12)(a), the Commission on Public Integrity ("Commission") finds that there is reasonable cause to believe that Powers & Company, Inc., knowingly and willfully violated Legislative Law §§1-e and 1-h, by failing to timely file a Statement of Registration disclosing a lobbying contract and accurately report to the Commission the compensation they received pursuant to the contract in January 2007 from their client, Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts.

As required by law, a copy of this notice is retained by the Commission for public inspection. Please be advised, that pursuant to Legislative Law §1-o(b)(i) a lobbyist, public corporation, or client who knowingly and willfully fails to file a statement or report within the time required for the filing of such report, shall be subject to a civil penalty for each violation in the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars. In addition, pursuant to Legislative Law §1-o(c), a lobbyist, public corporation, or client who knowingly and willfully files a false statement or report shall be subject to a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed fifty thousand dollars, to be assessed by the Commission.
